The Heritage Farm Museum and Village has made a Craft Studio in the Old Barn. Sewing, stitchery, spinning, weaving and related skills classes are scheduled. Students will use Singer treadle machines and barn looms to make projects.

For more information or to register for classes, call the Farm at 304-522-1244 from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Fees must be paid at registration in order to reserve a place in the class.

**SPINNING** During the morning, the student will prepare wool fibers and spin on a drop spindle. In the afternoon, the student will use a spinning wheel. By the end of the class, students will have the basics to spin. Materials are provided.

TEACHER: Kate McComas, well known weaver and spinner who presently works at the Huntington Museum of Art..

**NATURAL DYE** Learn to dye wool with four different natural dyes. Wash and prepare wool for dyeing, then dye in kettles over wood fire. Students will take home a sample book of naturally dyed yarns. Materials will be provided.

**WEAVING  
A RUG** Make a rug in a day on an old barn loom just like the pioneers did. The class will meet all day in the Old Barn. ALL materials are provided to make your rug. If you prefer a special color, you will need to provide your own fabrics. This can be an old sheet or fabrics you have around the house.

**MAKE A RUG** Choose your poison. Do you want to Braid a Rug, make a Toothbrush Rug or Crochet a Rug. We will supply fabric for the Toothbrush or Crochet rug. You will need to provide fabric for the Braid a Rug. Briaders, the toothbrush needle or the crochet hook will be provided. If you prefer the Briad a Rug you will need to cut or rip your fabric into 1 1/2 to 2 inch strips. Blue Jeans make wonderful fabric for this rug.

There will be two classes offered. Each class is a one day class.

TEACHER: Sandy Skidmore--Sandy is a Staff Teacher at the Farm Museum. She is multi-skilled and is excited to share the old crafts with todays crafters. She is a retired West Virginia Studies teacher and loves what she does.
