Conquistadors (, US also) or conquistadores (Spanish: [ko?kista?ðo?es]; Portuguese: [kõki?t??ðo???, kõkist??do?is]; lit. 'conquerors') were Spanish and Portuguese colonizers who explored, traded with and conquered parts of the Americas, Africa, Oceania and Asia during the Age of Discovery. Sailing beyond the Iberian Peninsula, they established numerous colonies and trade routes, and brought much of the New World under the dominion of Spain and Portugal.

After Christopher Columbus's arrival in the West Indies in 1492, the Spanish, usually led by hidalgos from the west and south of Spain, began building a colonial empire in the Caribbean using colonies such as Santo Domingo, Cuba, and Puerto Rico as their main bases. Los Conquistadores were a villainous jobber professional wrestling tag team in the World Wrestling Federation (WWF), consisting of two masked wrestlers known as One (or Spanish Uno for "one") and Two (or Spanish Dos for "two"). The original team consisted of José Estrada Sr. and Jose Luis Rivera.

Several other wrestlers made use of the gimmick in 2000 and 2003. Edge and Christian and the Hardy Boyz both won the WWF World Tag Team Championship as Los Conquistadores, although their reigns were later credited under their actual team names.

As a result of that ruling, he subsequently left a chunk of the coaching duties to assistant coach Stan Albeck since Chamberlain proved to not have much interest in coaching basketball as he did playing it. The team finished the season with a tied record for fourth place...

They finished fifth in points per game at 109.9, but dead last in points allowed at 115.5 per game.
